


From the Principal's Desk.....

A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

Bir Bikram Memorial College is affiliated to **Maharaja Bir Bikram University**, a newly set up State University, very recently. Till last year it was affiliated to Tripura University and is duly recognized by the University Grants Commission (UGC) under 12B and 2F categories. The college, established on 19th August, 1969 as **Bir Bikram Evening College** with Dr. S.B. Gupta as the first Principal, previously catered to the needs of those students who could not afford time to study during the day time. Accordingly, the working hours of the college was 3pm to 8 pm. The students-strength was not less than 300 students in its inception. The college set up at the premises of Maharaja Bir Bikram College. It started functioning with its unique time table with its mission to raise the standard of higher education along with extending an opportunity to the otherwise engaged students to the purview of higher education.

On 26th December 2002, the college started anew shifting its establishment to the present location wherein the Tripura University was housed in its beginning. There was a policy-change in the admission process – from only boys to a co-education college – this modification made to meet the demands of the hour. There was a new name too for the college. Since then the college is known as **Bir Bikram Memorial College**. At present, there are more than 3600 students studying in Commerce, Science (both physical and biological) and Humanities Stream. The present college-campus is spread over an area of more than 9.29 acres with lush green all-round the campus bordered with exotic varieties of trees and winding lake which becomes an abode of migratory birds in winter.

Of the three colleges that were affiliated to the newly set up **Maharaja Bir Bikram University**, this institution is fortunate enough to be one.

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

1. Any student passing H.S. (+2) examination or its equivalent with at least 4 subjects including English from any recognized Board/Council shall be eligible for admission to the 1st Semester of the **B.A/B.Sc (Honours)** programmes of studies subject to availability of seats and restriction on combination of subjects as stated provided that he/she has secured in that examination, at least
 - (i) 40% marks in aggregate and 45% marks in the relevant 'subject,
 - OR**
 - (ii) 35% marks in aggregate and 50% marks in the relevant subject,
 - OR**
 - (iii) 50% marks in aggregate for applying for a new subject not studied in H.S.(+2stage).
2. An applicant seeking admission to **B.Com. (Honours)** course:
In addition to **clause No. 1.** he/ she
 - (i) must have secured at least 40% marks in Mathematics at the Madhyamik or its equivalent examination,
 - OR,**
 - (ii) must have passed Mathematics in H. S. (+2) or its equivalent Examination.
 - OR,**
 - (iii) Must have passed the two Commerce papers in H.S. (+2) or its equivalent Examination

3. As regards marks-bar for admission against reserved seats / quotas for ST/SC/PH candidates the guidelines/instructions of University and State Government will be followed time to time. Relaxation of marks for ST/SC/PH candidates will be followed as per State Government norms.
4. A candidate who appeared but could not obtain pass marks in any subject at the H.S. (+2stage) examination will not be allowed to take up that subject in the Degree course.
5. An applicant will not be allowed to take Honours in any subject in which he/she passed in Compartmental Examination.
6. Any two of the following subjects will lead to B.Sc. Degree: Economics /Defence Studies /Mathematics.
7. Restriction on combination of subjects:-
 - (i) Two languages cannot be opted as General subjects.
 - (ii) Defence Studies and Education cannot be taken simultaneously as two Elective subjects.
 - (iii) Philosophy and Mathematics will not be allowed to choose as two Elective subjects at the same time.
8. Preference for admission will be given to candidates passed in the current year. Admission for the candidates passed in previous years will be limited subject to availability of seats.
9. Admission will be offered on the basis of merit.
10. Reservation for SC / ST /PH will be governed by State Government Reservation policy for both General and Honours/ Major Courses.
11. Application Forms which are not duly filled-in or incomplete shall be summarily rejected.
12. All admission processes to First Semester classes in the affiliated Degree Colleges shall be completed latest by 15th July of each academic year. In case of other semesters, provisional admission to subsequent semester classes be completed within fifteen days from the date of completion of previous semester examination.
13. A student will have to submit with 3 copies of recent passport size photographs. One of the photographs must be inserted on the prescribed form for registration with MBB University. Prescribed form for registration must reach within 30 days

from the last date of admission. No application for registration will be entertained after the expiry of this stipulated period.

- 14 A student will be allowed to change a subject(s)/stream within 15 days from his/her admission to the College, subject to the restriction of combination of subjects laid down by the respective college. No such change shall be entertained once application for University registration is forwarded to the University from the college.
- 15 No student will be allowed to prosecute two regular programmes offered by the MBB University and any other University simultaneously.

Important Note: Any of the above-mentioned regulations meant for the applicant is subject to change for some unforeseen but valid reason. The college-authority will not be responsible for such changes.

- v **All Admissions will be provisional subject to the fulfilment of criteria as laid down by the college/ University**

FACILITIES AVAILABLE IN THE COLLEGE LABORATORY

A) Computer Science

The computer science laboratories consist of adequate number of branded personal computers which are connected through LAN. Broadband Internet facility is also available. The computers are loaded with latest software as prescribed by the affiliating University. The college is planning to set up a separate high tech Computer Lab to cater to the needs of the students.

B) Physics, Chemistry & Music

The Physics, Chemistry & Music laboratories are well equipped with all the necessary instruments to carry out practical classes of the students as well as research activities of the teachers.

C) Library

The library of BBM College works as a support service for both the teachers and the students when it provides a platform for reading and learning. The library has a digital cataloging system for which the library can boast of. With this cataloguing system, the library assures smooth, user friendly service to its customers, the students, teachers and other office employees. The large collection of books on all the subjects is available to the teachers and students alike in both the Reference and Lending sections.. The library is enriched with a strength of approx... 50000 books funds purchased from UGC and DHE funds .In addition to this, the library also subscribe to dailies in English and Bengali languages. The students are guided by the library staff to staff to find out books on different subjects. Both the boys and girls have separate reading rooms. Besides, the teaching and non-teaching staff also take the advantage of this library. There are separate reading rooms for girls, boys and teachers in this library.

D) Classrooms

There are 32 spacious lecture halls/ classrooms well-furnished and ventilated. Each classroom is provided with green boards and teachers use dust-free chalks. The college also have five smart class rooms with facilities of using overhead projector and other audio- visual aids for classroom- lecture presentation.

E) Conference Hall

The conference hall in the college is a well-ventilated 100'x 50' hexagon shaped room with a sitting capacity of 500. This hall is primarily used to organize college level programmes / seminars etc.

F) Canteen

Our college canteen provides hygienic food and tea at a reasonable rate. The college canteen committee closely monitors the performance of the canteen getting feedback

from the teaching and non-teaching faculty as well as from the students.

G) National Cadet Cops

Among the students, NCC instills a sense of discipline, encourages a dedication towards service, inspires in community capacity-building and provides leadership training. The NCC unit of BBM College is one of the oldest under 13 Tripura B.N. NCC. The ANO of this college Unit is Sri Tapan Jyoti Malakar, Deptt of Political Science

H) National Service Scheme

NSS unit of the college plays an active role in boosting social and moral values among its volunteers so that they become responsible citizens. To develop love for humanity and a sense of solidarity is the primary goal of the NSS volunteers of the college. Aply guided by a programme officer, the volunteers, all students of this college, regularly attend awareness campaigns held inside the college and outside to spread the message how to combat social evils and superstitions engulfing the society. They also learn how to lead a healthy and hygienic life.

I) The Science Forum

In the college it plays an active role in developing a scientific outlook among its students through a number of cultural programmes and campaigns. The forum encourages the students to involve themselves more and more in science related activities and movement against superstitious beliefs in the society. The forum engages the students in science related programmes both within the college and outside.

J) Sports & Cultural Programmes

For all round development of one's personality, sports and cultural activities are essential along with regular academic activities. The college has provision for both outdoor and indoor

games. The college students are inspired to join sports activities at District level, State level and if possible national level sports. The college has shown its worth in various cultural and sports competitions at district or state level. A couple years back, the college won the championship trophy in College Football three times in a row. The college has plans to construct an outdoor Basketball and a Volleyball playground and a sports room with modern infrastructural facilities.

For quite a number of years, the students won several prizes and awards in Drama Competitions held at different parts of the state. The college organizes almost regularly cultural and literary programmes wherein students take part in huge number. There is a Wall Magazine ' **Naibaidya**' and a print magazine ' **Pratichi**' which are published annually with the poems, articles, short stories etc. of the students. Besides, there is another wall magazine **Dawn** managed by the English department. There are quiz and debates, seminars among the students almost throughout the year.

K) Distance Education Centre

The Distance Education Centre of BBM College was established in 2012 under the guidance of Directorate of Distance education, Tripura University. It offers Semester based B.A. pass course with elective subjects- Bengali, Political Science, History and Education. The admission to this course is done in July and August every year. The syllabus and examination pattern is similar with that of former TDC (B.A. Pass Course) of Tripura University. The contact classes are being conducted during Sundays and other holidays. In the current year more than 100 students are enrolled in this centre.

ICSI (Institute of Company Secretaries of India) Study Centre

The College has ICSI study centre which is a first one of its kind in Tripura. The centre is run by the college to cater the need of the aspiring students of Tripura want to pursue the

programmes as offered by **Institute of Company Secretaries of India**

M) The Teachers' Council

The Teachers' Council of this college is a non-statutory platform of all teachers, constituted voluntarily and in accordance with the convention of the college. The objective is to carry out academic and extra-curricular activities of the college as well as to assist the college administration to run the college smoothly. All the teachers are members of the Teachers' Council with the Principal as the Ex-officio President of the Council. There are several Committees like Discipline Committee, Academic & Examination Committee, Social Entertainment

Committee, UGC Committee, NAAC Committee. The Council plays a key role in maintaining a close relationship between the students and the teachers and in motivating the students in performing their activities in the college.

N) Students' council

The students' Council of the college works for the welfare of all the students and take necessary initiatives for the overall development of the college. The Council is an elected body comprising of 18 office bearers and 36 class representatives. The key office bearers of the council are the General Secretary and the Vice President. The Principal of the college is the ex-officio president of the council. The council extends its cooperation to maintain the discipline of the college and actively participates in all college programmes. The council also helps the students in the admission process. The council observes different co-curricular programmes in the college-premises. The council members are also members of anti -Ragging and anti-Sexual Harassment committees of the college.

The students have a strong belief that an ideal student should have a positive bent of mind towards learning.

O) Anti-Ragging Committee-

The college claims to have a ragging-free campus. Indiscipline within the campus is firmly dealt with by the college administration. To address the issues the committee comprising of some senior teachers and students' representatives regularly meets and take stock of the latest situation. A Committee is formed with Principal, 2 teacher and 2 students. But till date no complaint has seen received.

P) Committee against Sexual Harassment in work place

There is a committee against Sexual Harassment of Women and a Grievance Redressal cell in the college wherein the representatives of the teachers and students act as members. But there is no such incidents of sexual harassment in the college till date.

General rules and Regulations For students

Dress code:

The students of this college are to abide by the following dress code

1. Girls: White Salwar with white and blue checks Kameez and a white dupatta.
2. Boys: Shirts with white and blue checks and black trousers.
Students without this uniform are barred from entering the college-premises.

Discipline:

The students are directed to carry their Identity card within the college campus.

Use of motor bikes and bicycles is strictly prohibited within the campus.

These should be parked in the parking areas only.

Gossiping and loitering in the college-corridors, staircases and in the canteen during the class-hours are not allowed.

There is a ban on the use of Mobile phones inside the classes, Academic & Administrative buildings.

Attendance:

A student will be allowed to sit for the End-Semester examination only if he/she has 75% attendance of the total classes held in theory and practical classes separately in that Semester.

If any student remains absent for more than 15 days in a row, he/she has to contact the teachers of that department. If anyone remains absent for a month or more without prior intimation, his/her name will automatically be struck off from the attendance roll.

Rules for Internal Assessment

Students' performance will be monitored through a continuous evaluation process. Some marks are allotted for Internal Assessment. The marks will be added in the final mark sheet issued by the University. There is no provision for repeat or improvement test. If the student fails to appear for the internal assessment, he/she will be debarred from appearing the end semester examination conducted by the University.

Some Tips on Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) :

The CBCS provides choice for students to select from the prescribed courses (core, elective or minor or soft skill courses).

Types of Courses:

1. **Core Course (CC)**: A course, which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed as a Core course. In case of BA/BSc/BCom (General) core course is termed as Discipline Specific Core (DSC) and in BA/BSc/BCom (Honours) it is termed as Core Course (CC).
2. **Elective Course**: Generally a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/ subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.

Types Elective of Courses:

- ❑ **Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course**: Elective courses may be offered by the main discipline/subject of study is referred to as Discipline Specific Elective. The University/ Institute may also offer discipline related Elective courses of interdisciplinary nature (to be offered by main discipline/subject of study).
 - ❑ **Generic Elective (GE) Course**: An elective course chosen generally from an **unrelated discipline/subject**, with an intention to seek exposure is called a Generic Elective. A core course offered in a discipline/subject may be treated as an elective by other discipline/subject and vice versa and such electives may also be referred to as Generic Elective.
 - ❑ **Dissertation/Project**: An elective course designed to acquire special/advanced knowledge, such as supplement study/ support study to a project work, and a candidate studies such a course on his own with an advisory support by a teacher/ faculty member is called dissertation/project.
Project work/Dissertation is considered as a special course involving application of knowledge in solving / analyzing / exploring a real life situation / difficult problem. A Project/ Dissertation work would be of 6 credits. A Project/Dissertation work may be given in lieu of a discipline specific elective paper.
3. **Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)**: The Ability Enhancement (AE) Courses may be of two kinds: **Ability**

Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC). "AECC" courses are the

- courses based upon the content Knowledge enhancement;
- i. (AECC): (a) Environmental Science and (b) English/MIL Communication. These are mandatory disciplines.
 - ii. **SEC courses are value-based and/or skill-based and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, skills etc.**

I. ACADEMIC SESSION

1. There shall be six Semesters in B.A/B.Sc/B.Com (Honours/General) programme of Three Years duration. Each academic session will consist of two semesters:

First Year	:	First and Second Semesters
Second Year	:	Third and Fourth Semesters
Third Year	:	Fifth and Sixth Semesters.

2 Semester classification:

- Odd Semesters (First, Third and Fifth) : July – December
- Even Semester (Second, Fourth and Sixth): January – June.

Structure of Courses of the programme

Structure of courses of the programmes

1. The Degrees of Arts or of Science or of Commerce in B.A/ B.Sc/B.Com (Honours/General) programme shall be awarded only on successful completion of all the Semester Examinations. The Final results will be given on the basis of marks/grade obtained in 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th and 6th Semester Examinations taken together.

Students are to select from the prescribed courses (core, elective or minor or soft skill courses).

BA/BSc/B.Com Honours Programme: An Undergraduate programme in BA/BSc/B.Com Honours Degree in a discipline may be awarded if a student completes 26 papers in **six semesters**:

- (a) A student has to complete 14 core courses (CC) in the Honours subject.
- (b) 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC): (i) Environmental Science, (ii) Modern Indian Language
- (c) 2 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) based on the Honours subject.

- (d) 4 Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) courses based on in the Honours subject.
- (e) 4 courses of Generic Electives (GE) from the list of Discipline Specific Core (DSC) subjects for a particular subject other than the Honours subject within the combination allowed.

BA/BCom General Programme: BA/B.Com General Degree may be awarded if a student completes 24 papers in **six semesters**

- (a) 8 core papers taking 4 papers each in two disciplines (subjects) of choice within specified streams.
- (b) 4 core papers taking 2 papers each in Compulsory English and Compulsory MIL respectively.
- (c) 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) :(i) Environmental Science, (ii) MIL (Communicative).
- (d) 4 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) taking 2 papers each from 2 discipline specific core subjects
- (e) 4 Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) taking 2 courses each from 2 discipline specific core subjects
- (f) 2 courses from the list of Generic Electives (GE) courses from 2 discipline specific core subjects

BSc (General)-Physical Science Programme : BSc (General) Degree in Physical Science may be awarded if a student completes 24 papers in **six semesters**

- (b) 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC): (i) Environmental Science, (ii) MIL (Communicative).
- (c) 4 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) taking 1paper each from 3 discipline specific core subjects. Fourth SEC may be selected from any one from3 discipline specific core subjects as selected in item
- (d) 6 Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) taking 2 papers each from 3 discipline specific core subjects as selected in item (a) above.

NOTE: WHILE FILLING THE APPLICATION FORM FOR ADMISSION IN BA/BSC/BCOM HONOURS A CANDIDATE MUST HAVE TO SELECT ONE SUBJECT FROM THE LIST OF DISCIPLINE SPECIFIC CORE (DSC) SUBJECTS OTHER THAN THE HONOURS SUBJECT WITHIN THE COMBINATION ALLOWED. THE FOUR COURSES OF THE SELECTED SUBJECT WILL BE THE FOUR COURSES OF GENERIC ELECTIVE FOR 1ST, 2ND, 3RD AND 4TH SEMESTERS RESPECTIVELY.

5. RESTRICTION OF COMBINATION OF SUBJECTS

There shall be the following restriction on combinations of subjects in BA/BSc/BCom (General & Honours):-

- Subjects under Group -A cannot be taken with Group B.
- If a candidate desires to take Physics and/or Statistics in Under Graduate Programme (General) as elective subject, he/she shall have to study Mathematics as one of the three elective subjects.
- A student shall not be allowed to offer more than one language subject as Discipline Specific Core (DSC) subject.

- Subject taken as Honours shall not be taken as a Generic Elective (GE) Subject.

A candidate shall have to pass the following subject(s) in the H.S(+2) or its equivalent examination as indicated under column –B if he/she desires to take particular subject in BA/BSc/B.Com (General & Honours) under column-A.

i. Physics	Physics & Mathematics
ii. Chemistry	Chemistry & Mathematics
iii. Mathematics	Mathematics
iv. Economics (Hons)	Mathematics

The College authority may further restrict the choice of combinations of subjects according to the infrastructural facilities and faculties available in the concerned college.

Note:

- a) For BA/BSc/BCom (General & Honours) Degree Ability Enhancement Course (AECC) consisting of Environmental studies and MIL/English (communication) will be compulsory.*
- b) Other than above, for BA/BCom (General) Degree there will be four compulsory courses out of which two will be English (compulsory core) and two will be MIL (compulsory core).*
